

Figure A1: Impact of percentage_avoided_that_conservative on refs_total







Figure A2: Impact of percentage_costs_ward on refs_total







Figure A3: Impact of percentage_avoided_operated_locally on refs_total







Figure A4: Impact of percentage_referrals_surgical on refs_total






Figure A5: Impact of effectiveness_constant on refs_total
