### **Block 1: Building relationship and trust, maximizing storytelling**

*Question 1 (intro general):* Can you tell us something about your daily work? What does your day look like?

*Question 2 (intro mosquito diseases):* How is your work related to mosquito-borne diseases?

### **Block 2: Going into depth**

*Question 4 (substantive uncertainty):* How do you deal with open questions or information needs you have regarding policy making or implementation on mosquito-borne diseases?

*Question 5 (priorities):* What are the most important goals/priorities you have regarding mosquito-borne diseases?

*Question 6 (decisions):* Can you give us examples of how decisions are made on a complex issue for which there is not an immediately obvious solution?

*Question 7 (dependencies):* Can you tell us something about how you collaborate with others on mosquito-borne diseases?

*Question 3 (problem perception):* What do you think are the biggest organizational/coordination challenges facing the Netherlands regarding mosquito-borne diseases? What makes it complicated?

*Question 8 (tools):* How are you trying to make the issues manageable? What is in the "toolbox" of coordination tools?

**Block 3: crucial/sensitive issues**

*Question 9 (frustrations):* Have there been times when things really just didn't work out? Can you give examples of this?
