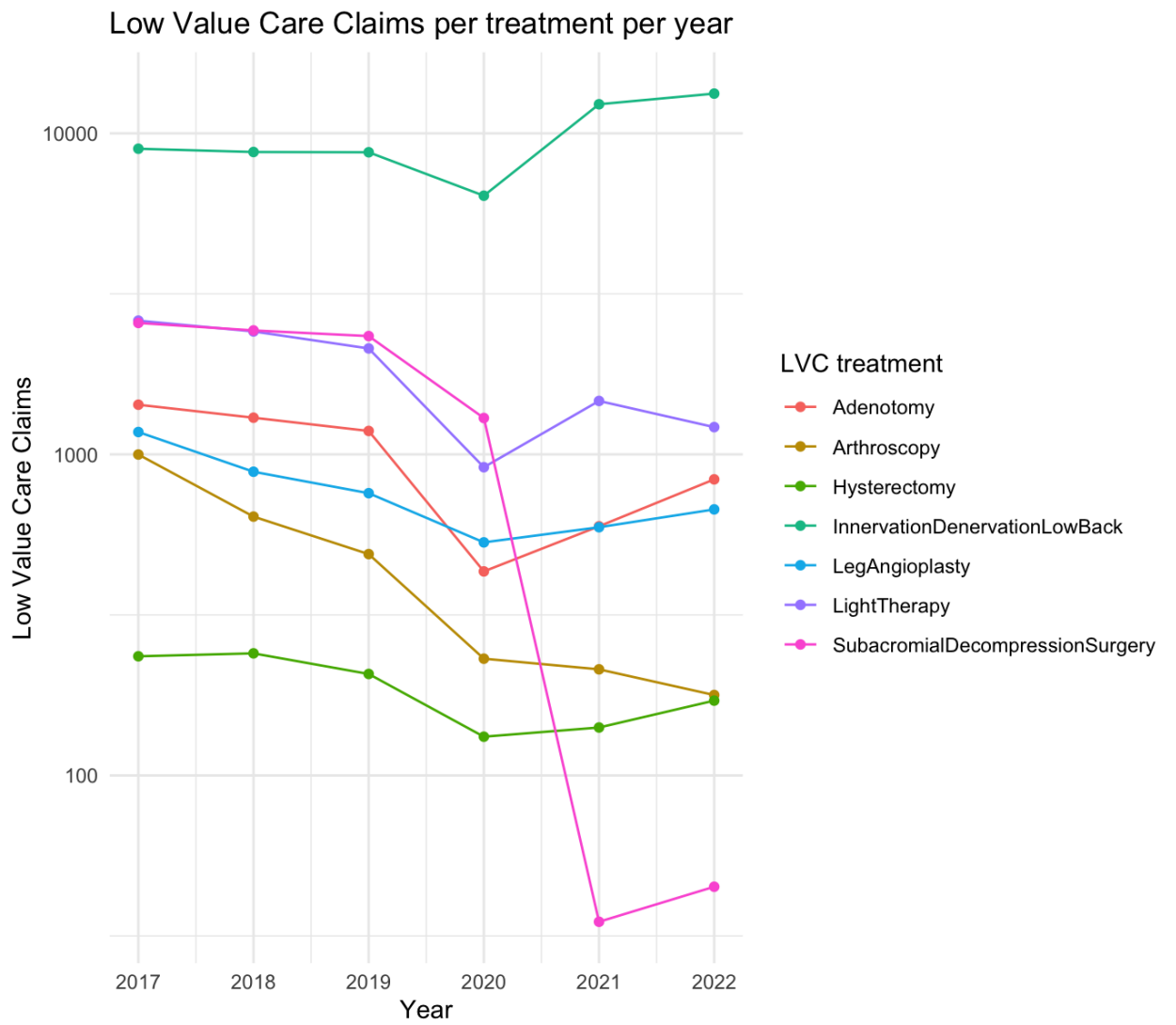


Figure S1. Volume LVC treatments per type from 2017-2022
