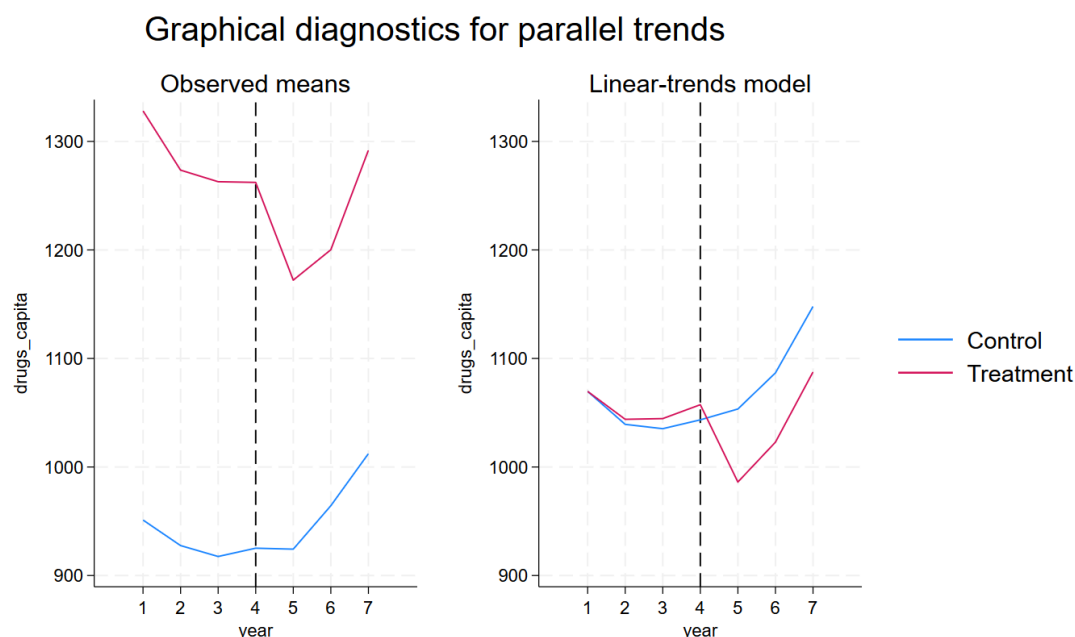


Figure S3.2. Graphical analysis of parallel trends: 1st consumption quintile.

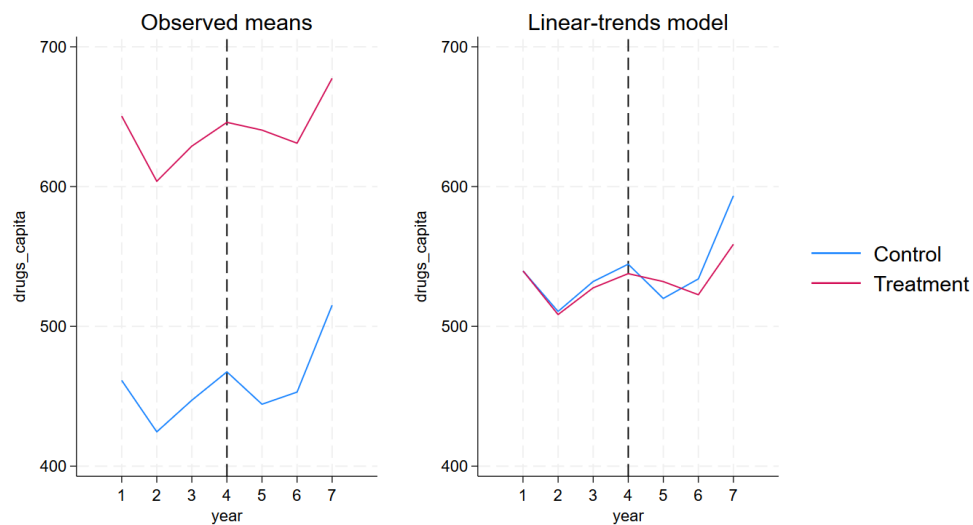


Figure S3.3. Graphical analysis of parallel trends: 2nd consumption quintile.

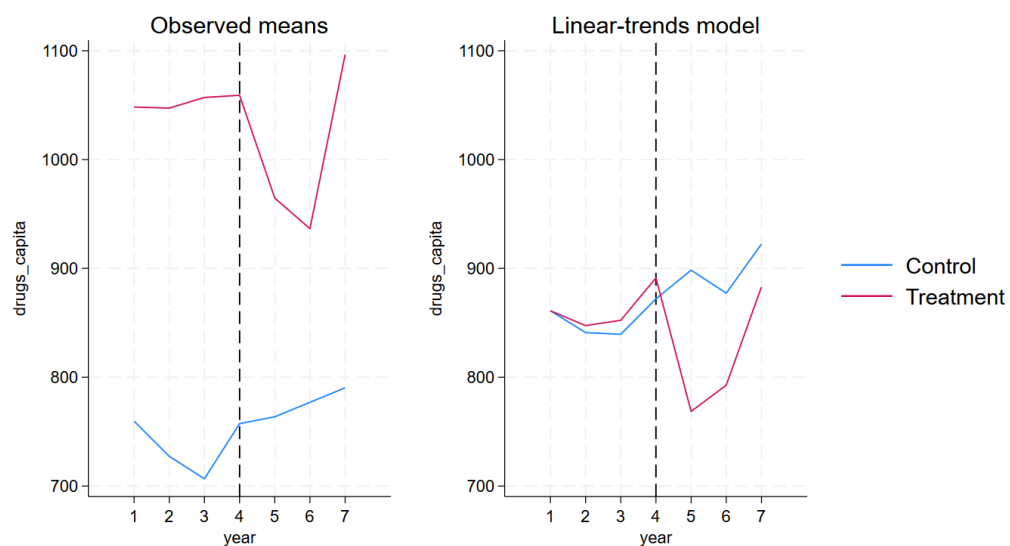


Figure S3.4. Graphical analysis of parallel trends: 3rd consumption quintile.

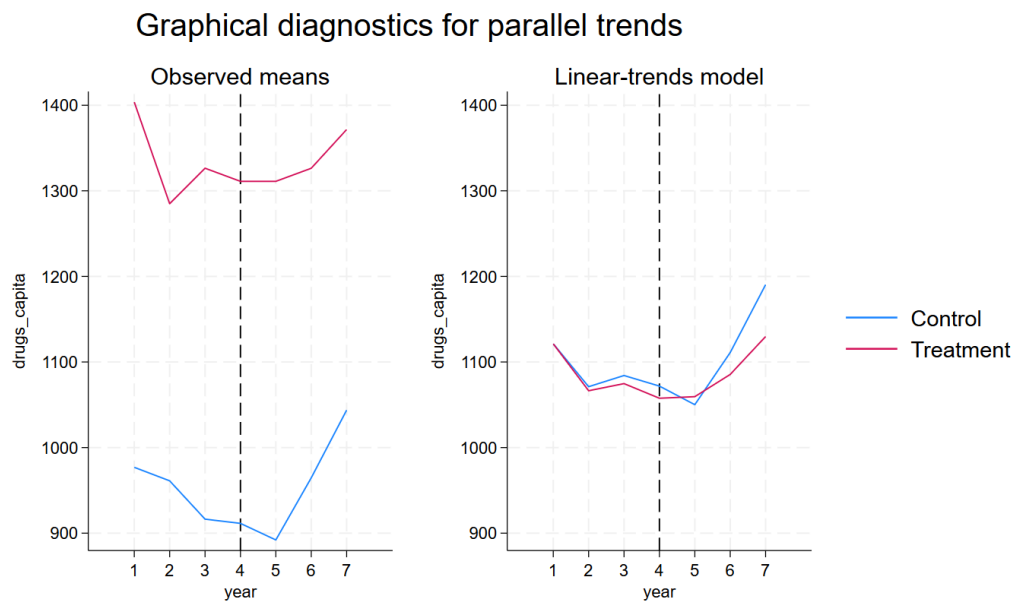


Figure S3.5. Graphical analysis of parallel trends: 4th consumption quintile.

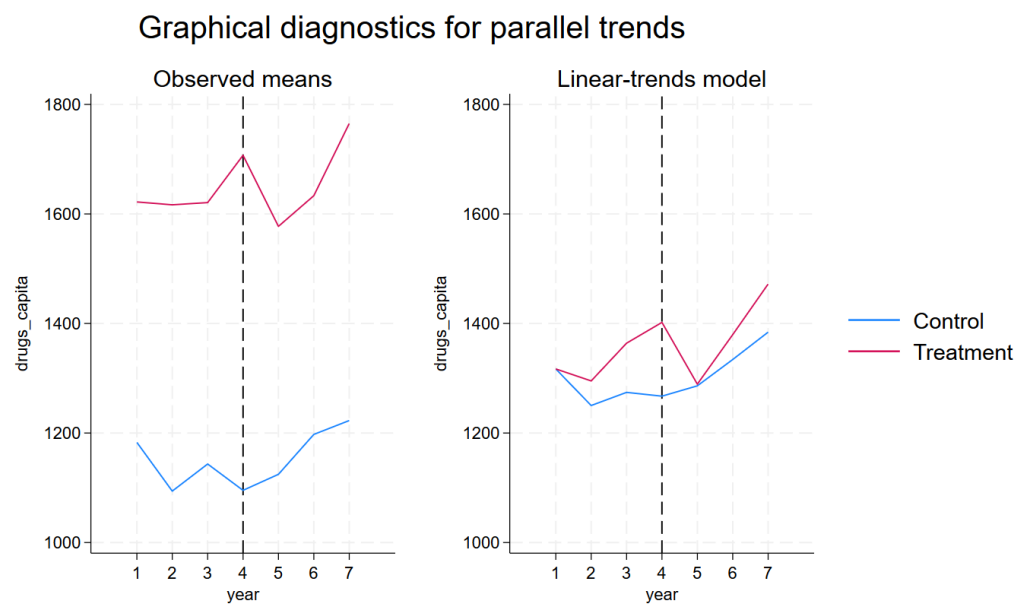


Figure S3.6. Graphical analysis of parallel trends: 5th consumption quintile.
